POSITION OVERVIEW

CLASS CHAPLAIN OF THE ASSOCIATED STUDENT COUNCIL (ASC) will serve as a primary representative of their class to the various facets of the University, and the community at large, through shepherding of peers and cultivating spiritual growth. The Class Chaplain will assist in accomplishing the goals and objectives set forth by the Department of Student Development, the Office of Spiritual Development, and the Associated Student Council.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

1. Be enrolled as a full-time undergraduate ONU student
2. Maintain a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA
3. Profess Jesus Christ as Lord and be committed to living a consistent life of Christian witness on and off campus, representing Christ and Olivet
4. Be in good standing with the Department of Student Development, the Office of Spiritual Development, and the Associated Student Council
